
ASSESSMENT TEST GUIDELINES

The information below will help you prepare for your assessment test appointment. These instructions will NOT be covered on the day of your test, so you MUST read them completely in order to understand all of the policies before coming to the assessment.

After the Assessment (Placement and Registration)

Placement and registration is different for each student type.

UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

- You will receive an email within 2 business days with your results.
- You will be registered administratively if you have no other holds or course conflicts. Placeholder course,
 PESL 001, converts to the courses you need.
- Courses begin 1 week later than other Illinois Tech courses.

GRADUATES STUDENTS

- You will receive an email within 2 business days with your results.
- You will be registered administratively if you place into courses and have no other holds or course conflicts.
 Placeholder course, PESL 000, converts to the course you need.
- Courses begin 1 week later than other Illinois Tech courses.

<u>INTENSIVE ENGLISH AND IFY/IGY PATHWAY PROGRAM STUDENTS</u>

- When you arrive, you will be registered for IEP 000, which is a placeholder course.
- You will receive your placement at orientation after you have taken the placement test.
- You register yourself for courses during orientation. You will need to drop the placeholder course, IEP 000, when you register for the courses you need.

Test Information

Below is basic information on all of the assessment tests we administer.

Who takes assessments?

Requirements are different for each student; therefore, all students do not take all tests listed below.

- Undergraduates assess in Listening, Reading, Writing, and Speaking.
- Graduates are only assessed in the area or areas that are considered lacking proficiency based on TOEFL/IELTS sub-scores. You will not assess in all four areas unless your TOEFL/IELTS sub-scores indicate you are lacking proficiency in all areas.
- Students submitting Duolingo scores must assess in all four skill areas regardless of total score.
- Intensive English and IFY/IGY Pathway Program students take an integrated skills test. The integrated skills test includes Listening, Speaking, Reading, and Writing.

About the Tests

LISTENING - Undergraduates and Graduates

- 22 multiple choice questions. The test is not timed.
- You will listen once, and may repeat 2 additional times. You may NOT take notes.
- Use a headset to listen. There is time to adjust the volume.
- Move your mouse so the computer doesn't go to sleep.

READING - Undergraduates and Graduates

- 20 multiple choice questions. The test is not timed.
- You will read several passages and answer questions after each passage. You may NOT take notes.
- Wear the headset to cancel noise.
- Move your mouse so the computer doesn't go to sleep.

WRITING - Undergraduates and Graduates

- Test consists of reading some information and writing an essay.
 - o Test is timed; you will have 70 minutes to write your essay.
 - o If you would like paper and pen to plan your essay, you can raise your hand during the test. Monitor your time as we recommend only spending 10 minutes or less planning before starting to write.
- Type your essay on the computer. The paper is only for notes and planning; you must NOT write your essay
 on the paper. The paper and pen are collected at the end.
- Wear the headset to cancel noise.

SPEAKING - Undergraduates and Graduates

- The speaking assessment consists of listening to directions and verbally completing speaking tasks. The test is approximately 20 minutes, and it moves quickly. You may NOT take notes.
- You will use a headset with a microphone, and there is time to adjust the volume before starting the test. We
 recommend that you move your mouse so the computer doesn't go to sleep.
- The speaking test has 6 parts: you will (1) read sentences aloud, (2) repeat sentences you hear, (3) answer simple questions, (4) arrange words into sentences, (5) listen to and retell stories, and (6) answer open-ended questions. View Speaking Test Instructions here.
- Wear the headset to cancel noise.

INTEGRATED SKILLS (SPEAKING, LISTENING, READING, WRITING) -

Intensive English and IFY/IGY Pathway Students

- Speaking, listening, writing, and reading. The test is approximately 60 minutes. You may NOT take notes.
- Use a headset with microphone to listen and speak. There is time to adjust the volume.
- Move your mouse so the computer doesn't go to sleep.
